

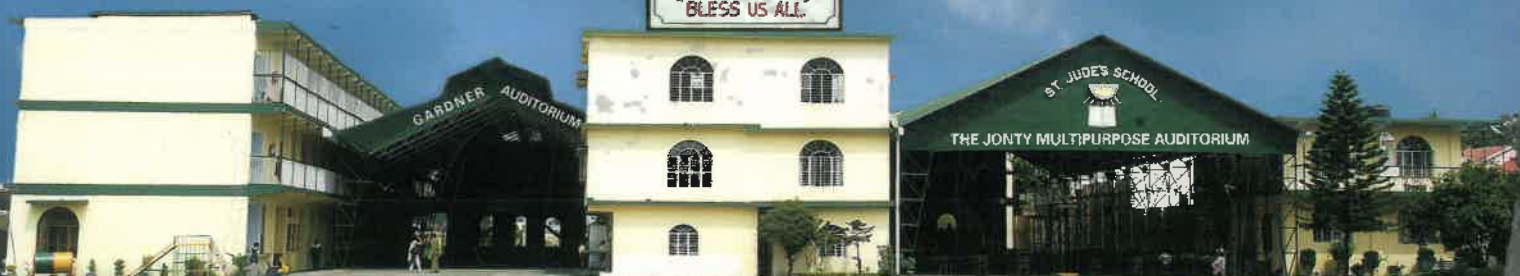

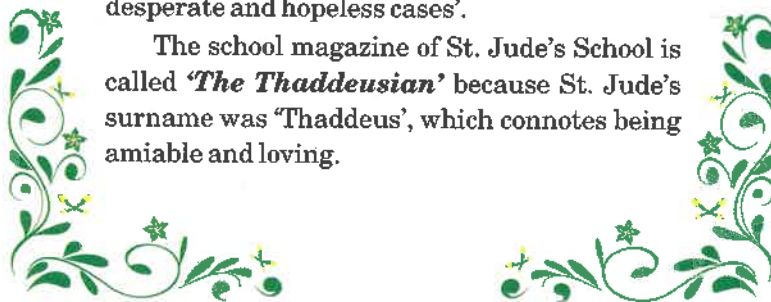


### *St. Jude Thaddeus*

A game of abstract strategy, Chess has always been the game of wise. Patience and confidence are the essentials of Chess, while tactics is something without which the game cannot exist.

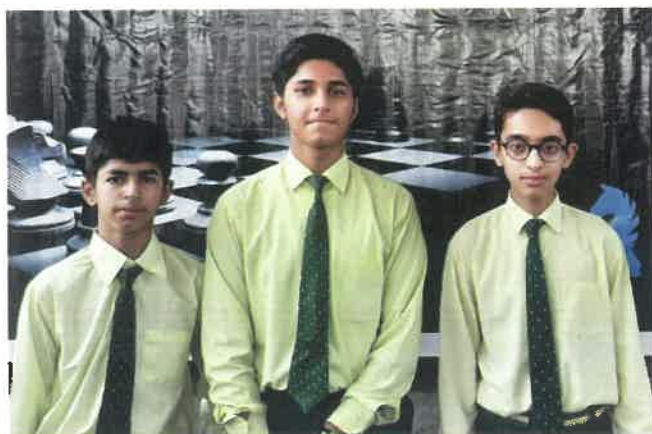

Matches were played in the following categories: Under-12, Under-14, Under-16 and Under-18. Each

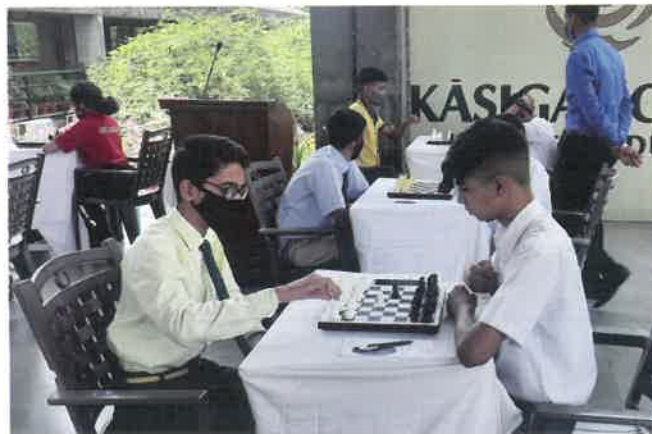

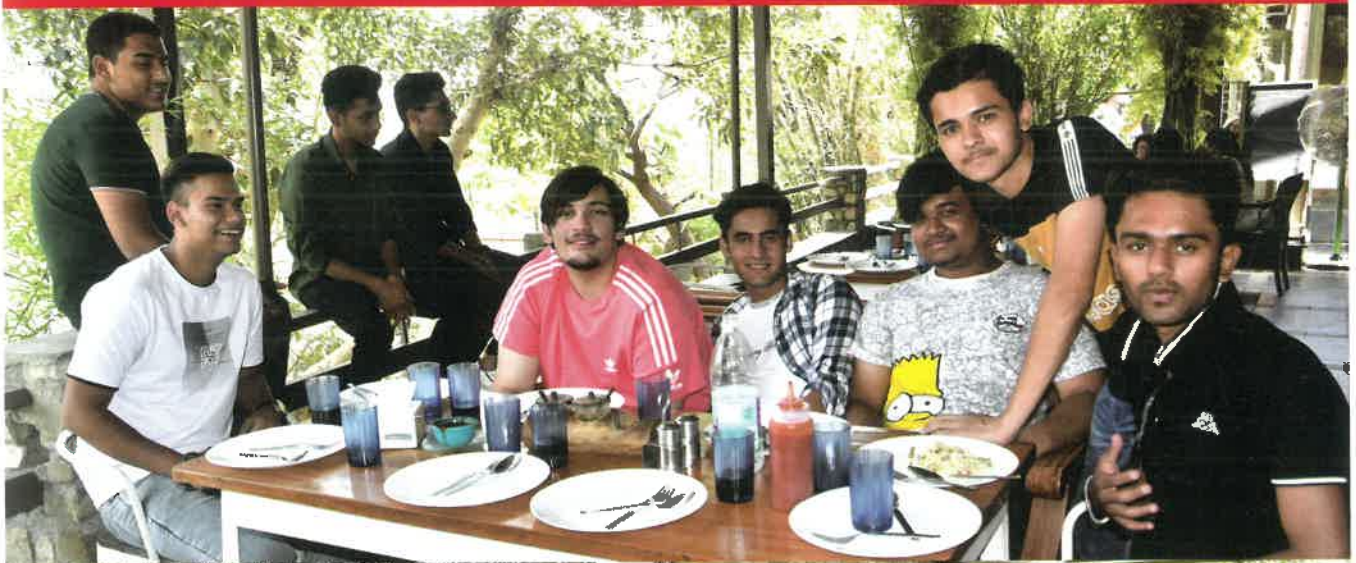

This year the Competition was tough as each House

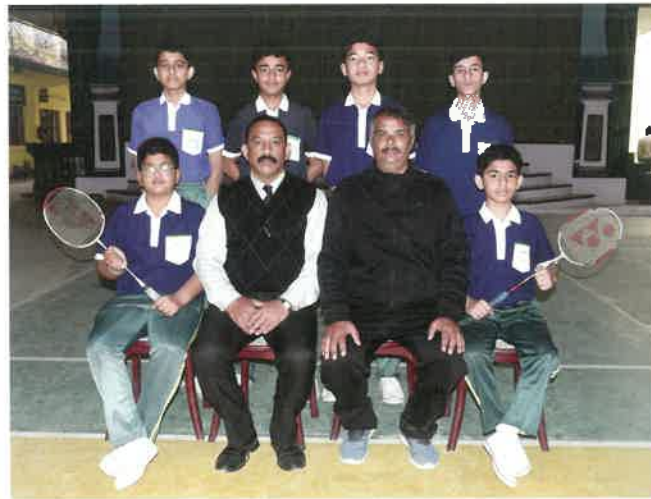

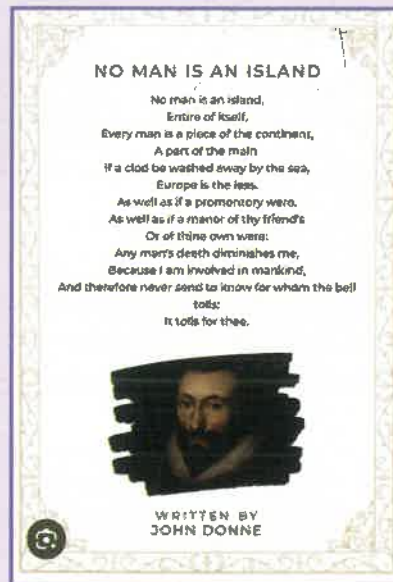

It was a great experience for all of us. Though we could not win the Tournament but we learned a lot by participating in it.



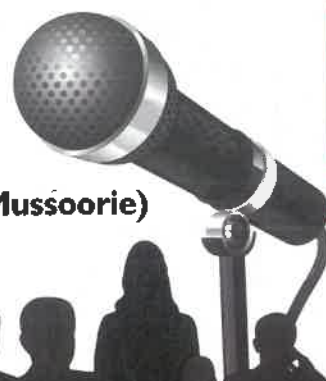

She requested everyone to hoist the National Flag in their houses.

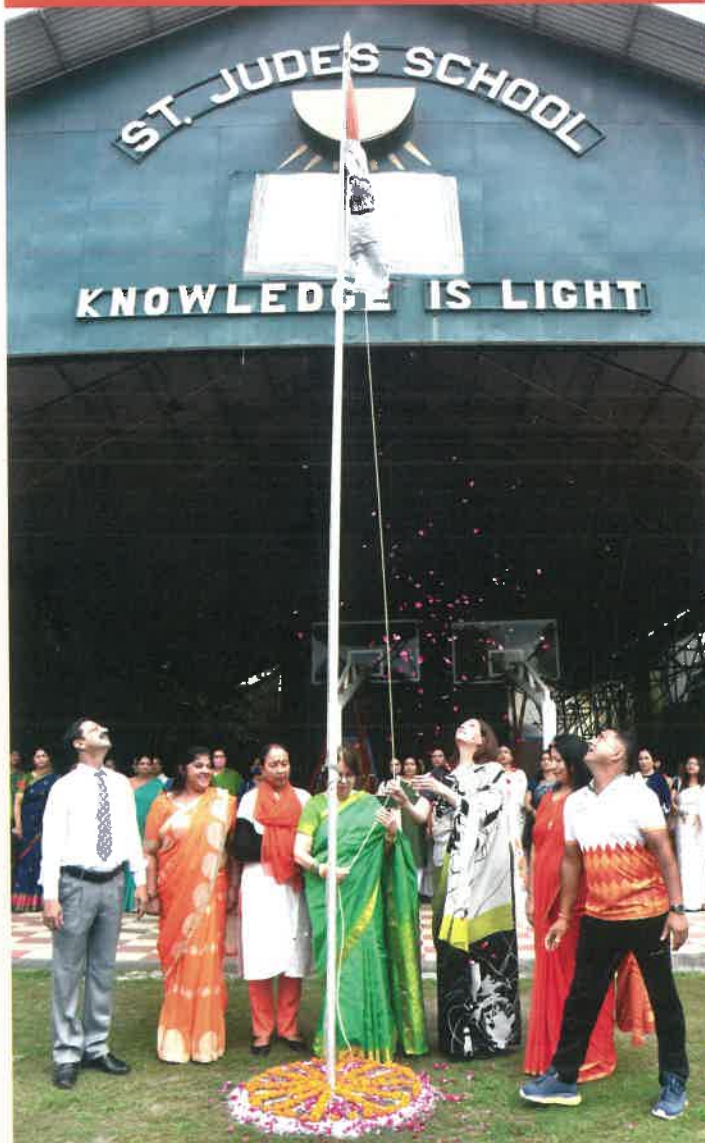

entertainment were handled very well by the participants.

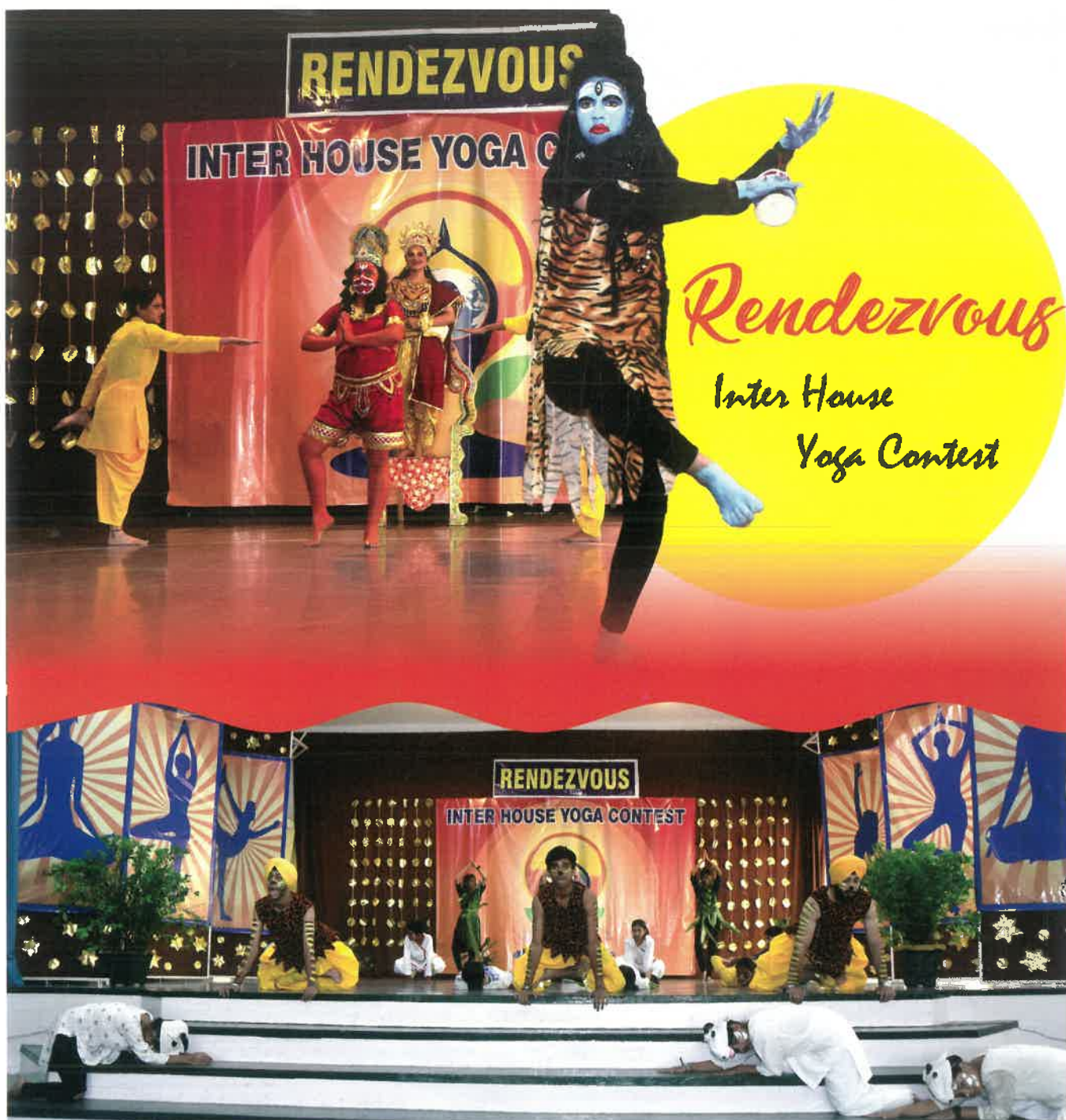
The Quiz was keenly contested by all the four Houses but Gardner House bagged the First position with 120 points.

Yoga is a practice which plays an important role in relaxing the mind and body and boosting people's immune system.

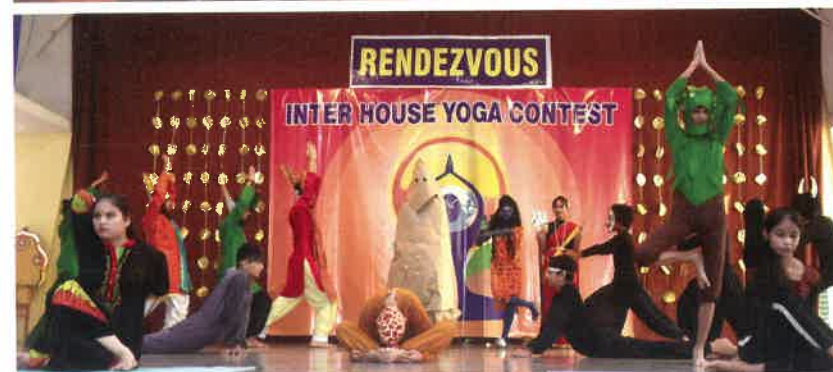
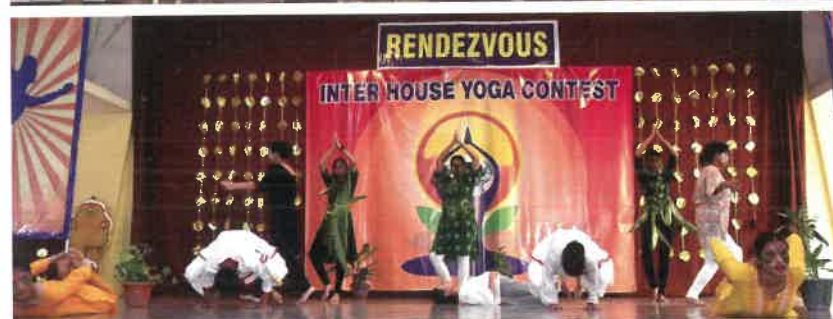
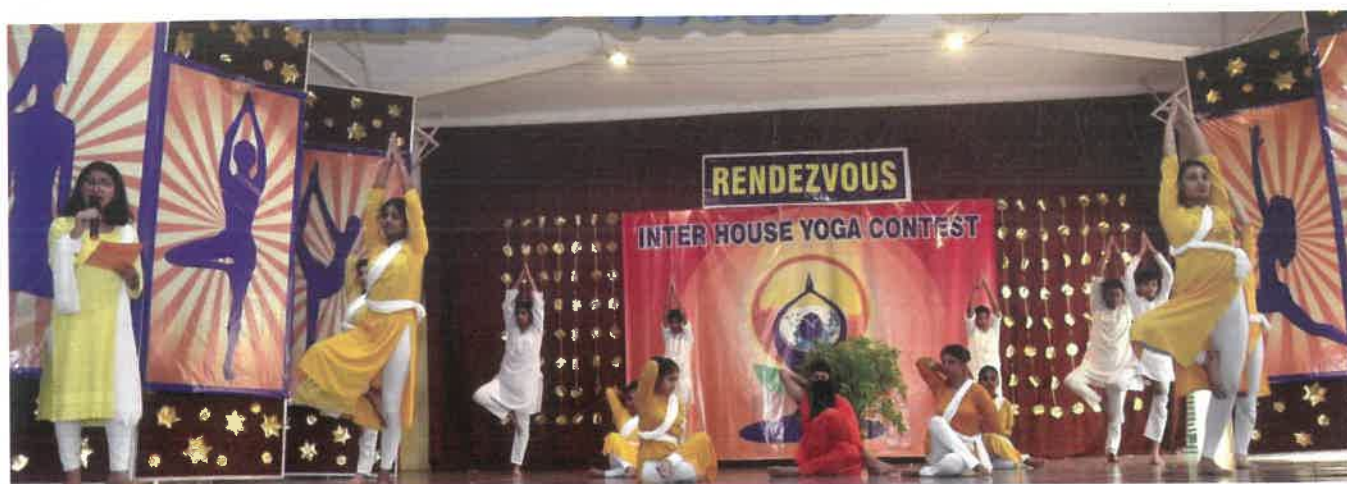
Each House performed various stories of Indian culture illustrating the importance of Yoga in the life of each individual. First we had Gardner House depicting the

The Judges appreciated all the participants. In regards to the results there was a tie between Khanna House and





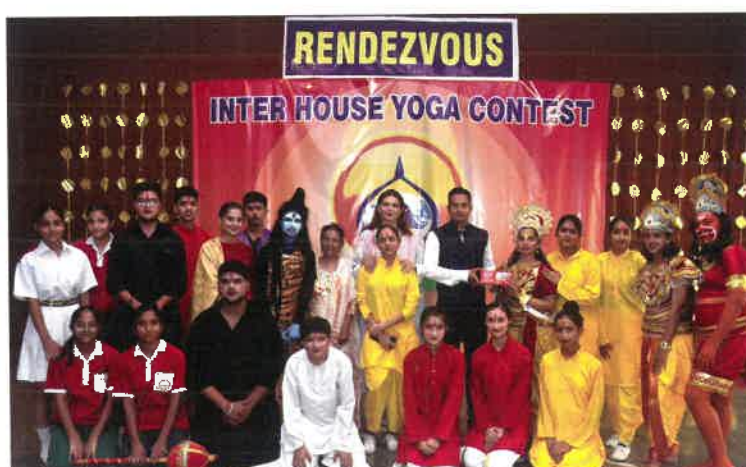

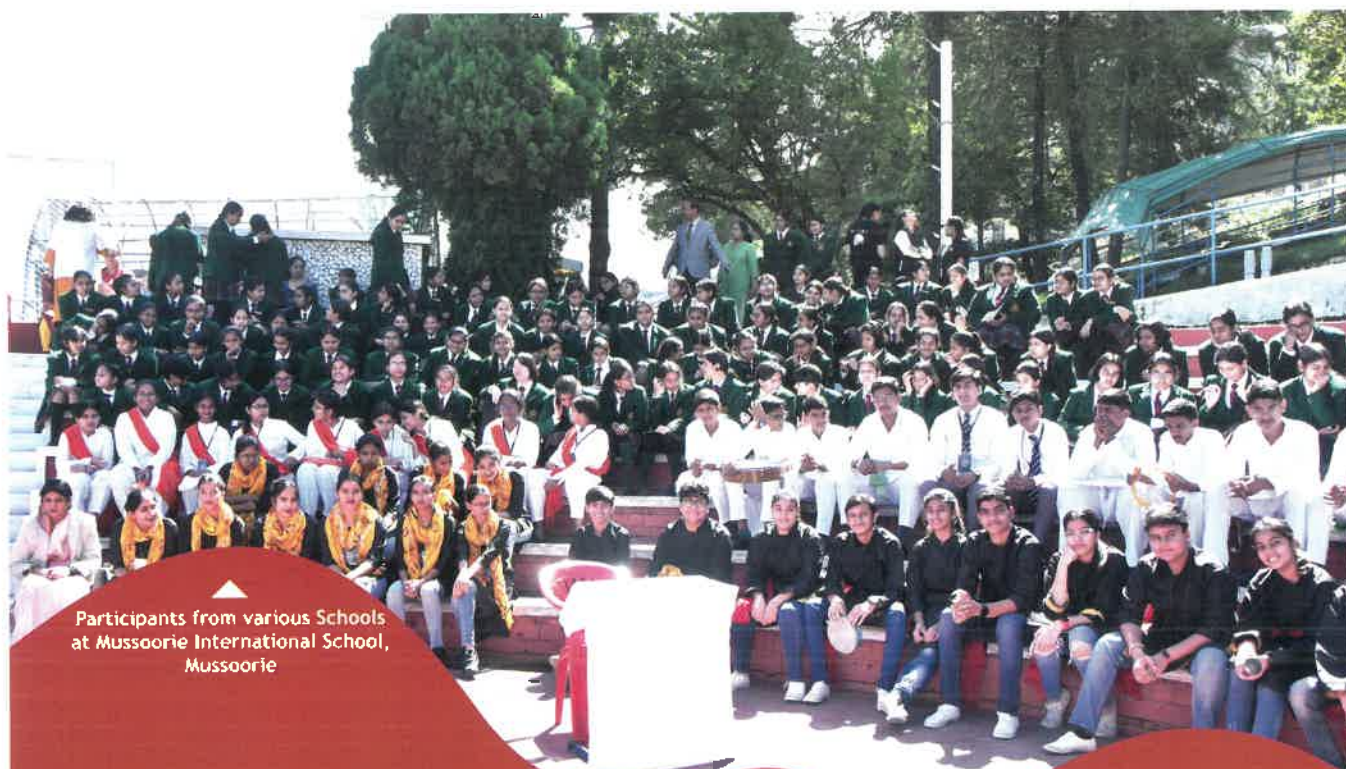

everyone's attention and this was highly appreciated by the audience. Every one clapped and cheered for the ecstatic Winning teams.

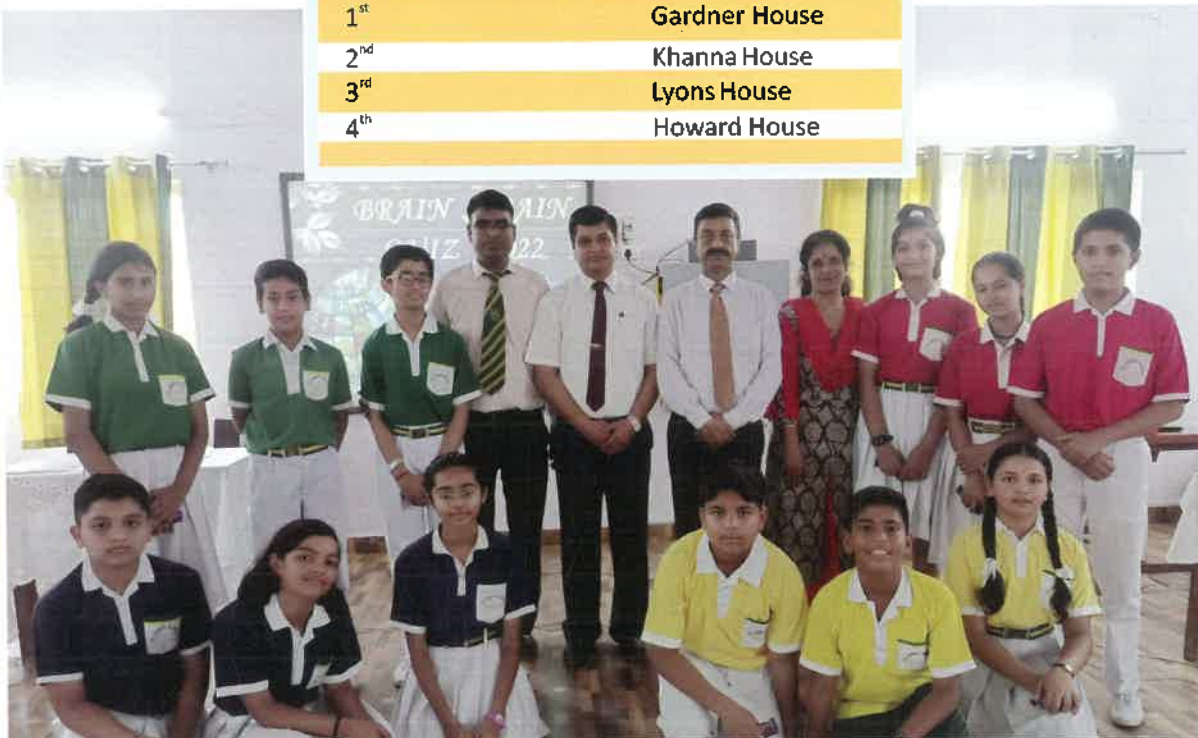

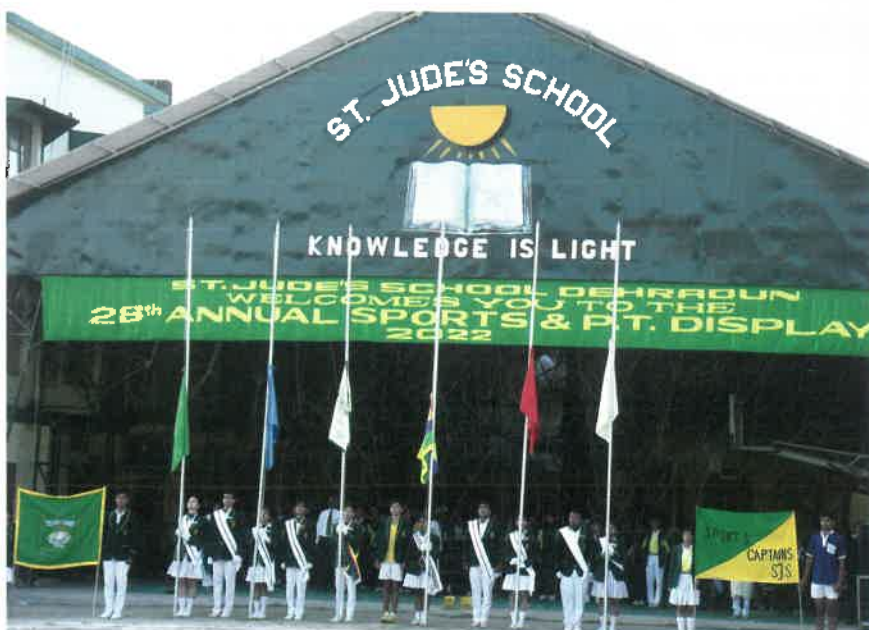

## 74<sup>TH</sup> REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION AT ST. JUDE'S SCHOOL



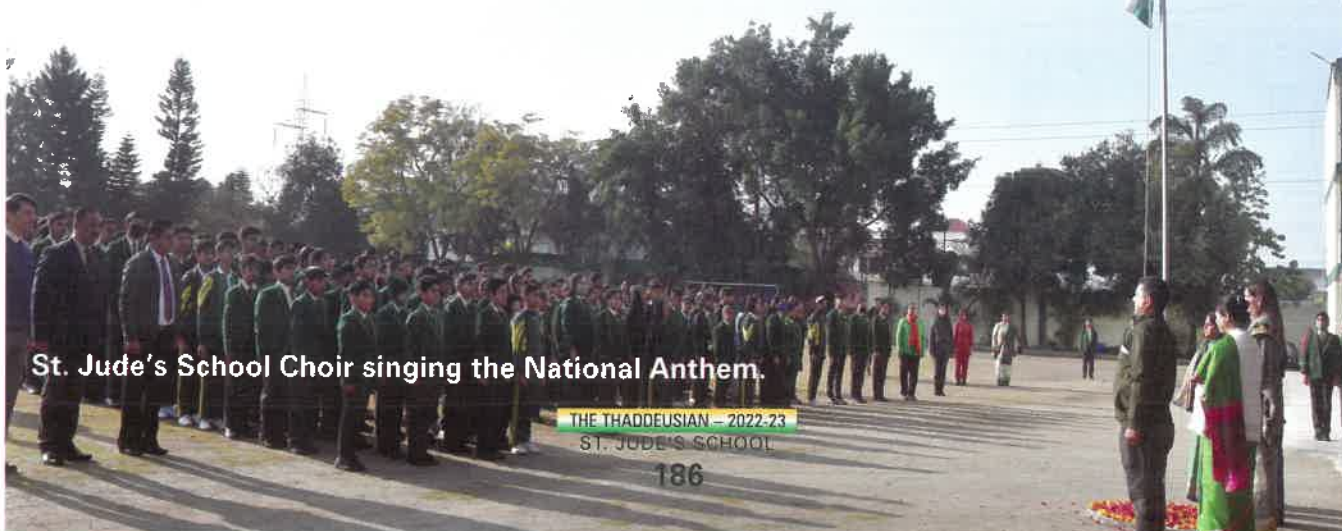

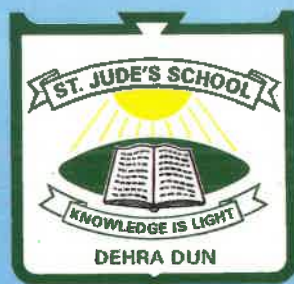
