

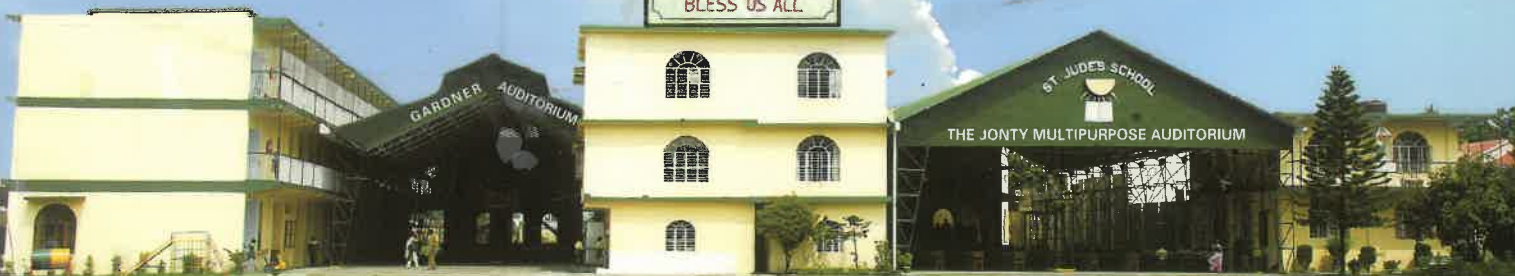

held on 9th May, 2015



I would like to welcome our Chief Guest, Major Gen. Shammi Sabharwal, General Officer Commanding, Headquarters Uttarakhand Sub-Area and his gracious wife Mrs. Sumita Sabharwal to St. Jude's 21st Annual Speech and Prize Day 2015.

Good afternoon to all present here this evening.

Parents, you send your ward to our School and keep in touch with us at all times well knowing that the Teachers in our School care deeply for your children and along with your help we are confident we shall bring the best out in each child.

Our aim in St. Jude's School is to make every child a confident and good citizen of our country.

I would like to state that our students have brought great laurels to our School.

Congratulations to our ICSE & ISC students, Teachers and Parents for the excellent Board Results.

We had 100% results in both ICSE and ISC examination 2014.

Out of 204 children who appeared for the ICSE Examination, 28 children scored 90% and above. Top Scorer in ICSE was Rishita Gogia who got 97% marks.

Out of 175 children who appeared for the ISC Examination, 14 children scored 90% and above. Shivani Verma topped by scoring 96%.

The year 2014-15 has been an eventful year for our students in the sports field.

1. In the 'Senior Boys Council Futsal Tournament 2014-15' held at the Touchwood School our school was the Winner.
2. In the '19th Gardner Premier League, Inter School Indoor Cricket - 2014' our School was the Winner.
3. In the '7th Rohitash Memorial Super 8's Boys Cricket Tournament - 2014' St. Jude's School was the Winner.
4. In the 'Little Master Inter School Soccer Cup - 2014' Organized by Raja Rammohan Roy Academy our team lifted the Cup.
5. St. Jude's School lifted the First T 20 'Times Doon Shield Inter School Cricket Challenge Trophy - 2014' by defeating St. Joseph's Academy on the Cricket Ground of Abhimanyu Academy.

This year we also excelled in the Co-curricular activities apart from the sports field.

1. In 'Quanta' – an International Academic Festival organized by the City Montessori School, Lucknow, in which Over 70 teams from 15 different countries including Germany, Russia, Malaysia, Brazil and Finland participated – Varun Gupta and Akshay Jain of St. Jude's School came 3rd in the Science Quiz. They

received a beautiful trophy for their achievement.

2. In 'Spectrum 2014' - an Inter School Singing & Dance Competition organized by St. Thomas' College, our school was the winner in the Solo Singing Category and were declared overall winner of the event.

3. Carman School, Prem Nagar hosted the 'Council Senior Inter School Dance & Singing Competition - 2014' in which our school was the Winner.

4. In the 'Council Junior School Singing and Dance Competition - 2014' organized by Carman School, Dalanwala, St. Jude's School was declared as the Winners.

5. We also participated in the 'World Scholar's Cup' hosted by Unison World School, Dehradun. St. Jude's School won the trophy for the Best Rookie Team; the trophy for the 3rd place in the Team Debate; and also got the trophy for the 3rd place in the Scholar's Bowl (Quiz).

6. In the Inter School Hindi Debate at Cambrian Hall, Arpit Pandey and Risabh Gusain of St. Jude's School were declared as the Best Speakers.

7. In 'MindSpree-2014', organized by St. Jude's School –

- Rahul Singh of St. Jude's School with his logical and reasonable arguments was judged as the Best Speaker.
- In Mega Poster Competition - St. Jude's School came 2nd.
- Individual Art Competition Category B (for Classes VI - VIII) – Riya Singh Chaudhary was judged the Best.

Thank you Ms. Michelle Gardner (Vice-Principal) for guiding the students to achieve these heights and bringing laurels to the School. I also extend my thanks to Teachers for training and giving their best.

In St. Jude's 3557 students are getting education under 126 well trained Teaching Staff.

Parents, you will be happy to know that St. Jude's School grants fee concession to the poor and deserving students. We at St. Jude's try and help as many students as we can. We at St. Jude's never ask for Re-admission fee in Class XI.

The School is also providing 100% fee concession to 207 students and 50% fee concession to 180 students. There are 12 students who are getting Full-Freeship.

Students who score 5 or 6 points in the ICSE Exams get 100% Fee Concession for his further studies in this school. Those who score 7 or 8 points get 50% fee concession.

We provide 100% fee concession to our Teachers'

wards. And so, ladies and gentlemen, we are spending Rs. 75 Lacs annually on scholarships and fee concessions.

You all will be glad to hear that today 347 students are getting prizes for their academic performances.

Classes VI to XII : 60 students

9 students are getting special prizes.

New technology continues to emerge and influence the classroom learning environment. Students now have immediate and unlimited access to digital content, resources, and databases. Keeping this in view, we have increased 7 more Smart Classes in our school. We now have 36 Smart Class Rooms.

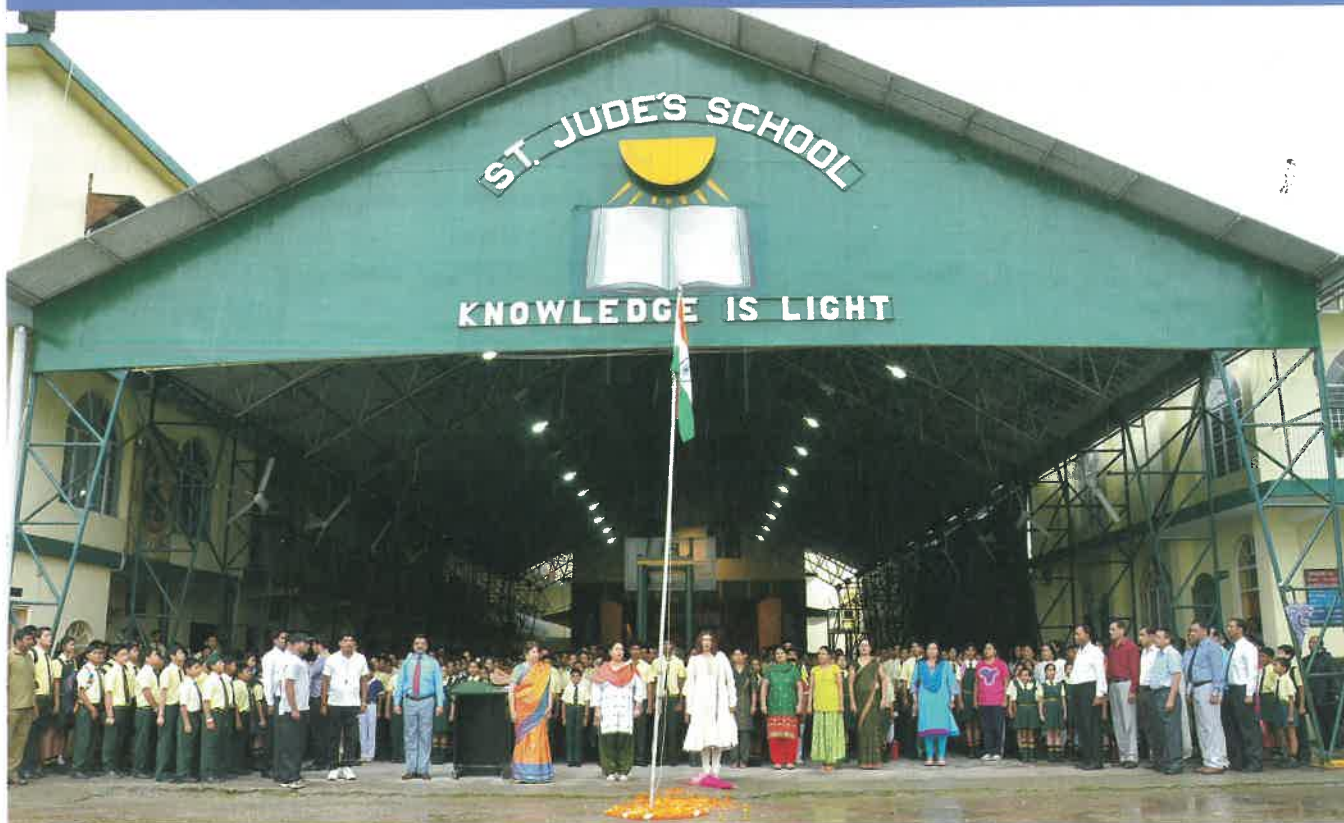

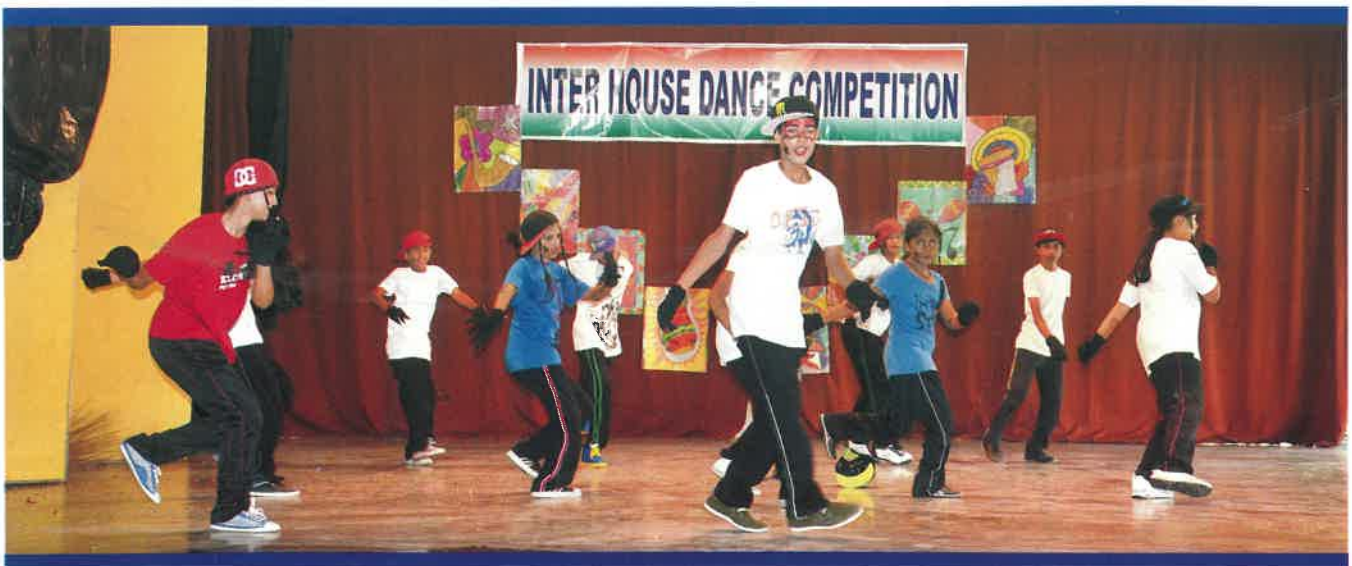

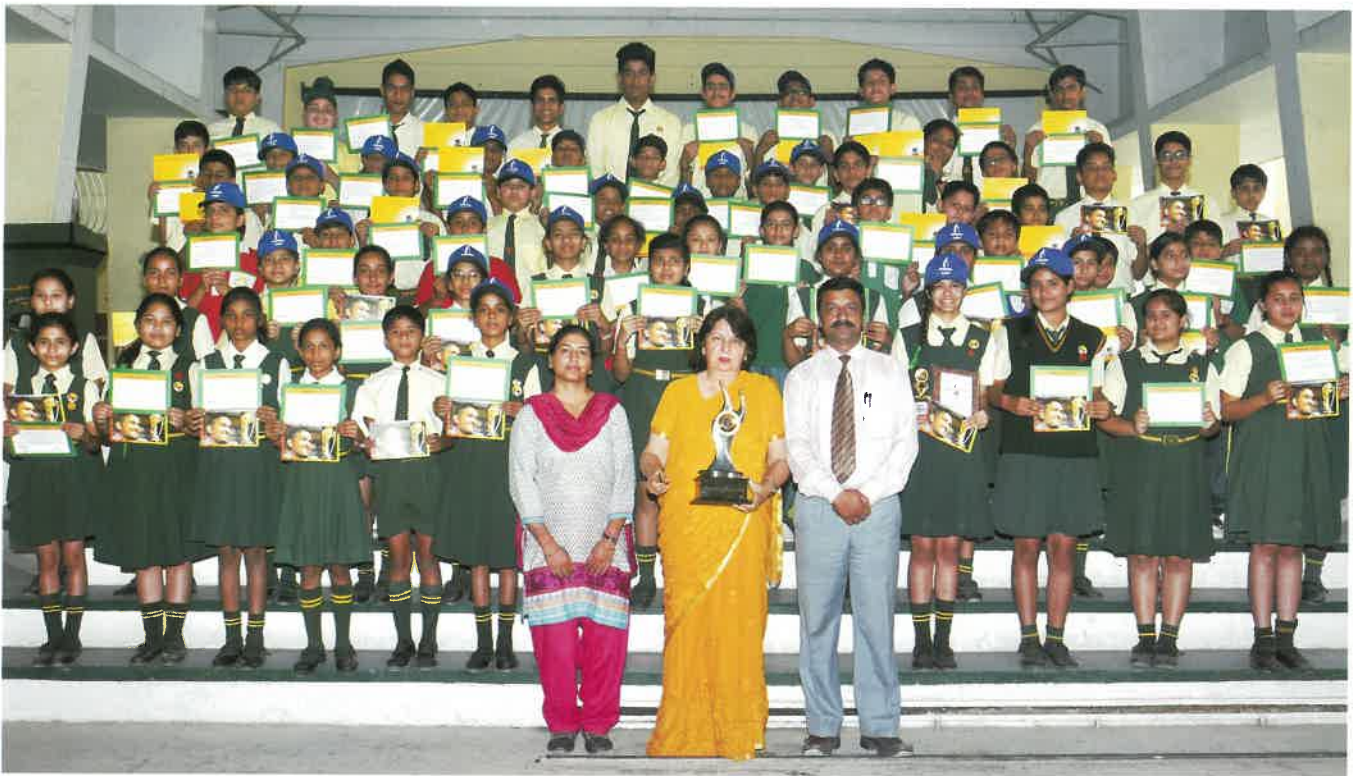
HelpAge India, registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860, is a leading NGO working for disadvantaged elderly senior citizens for more than three decades.

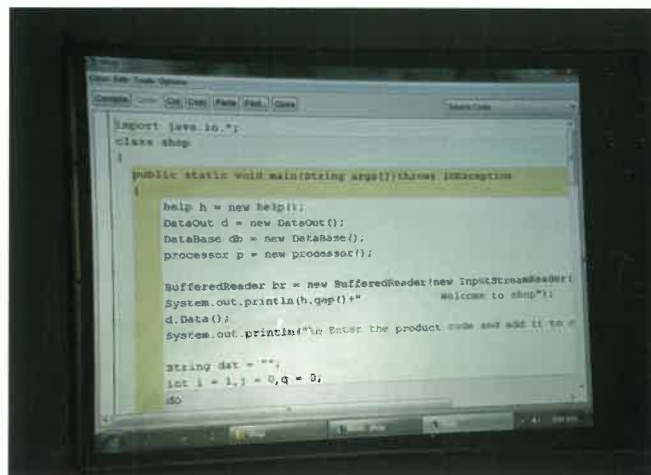

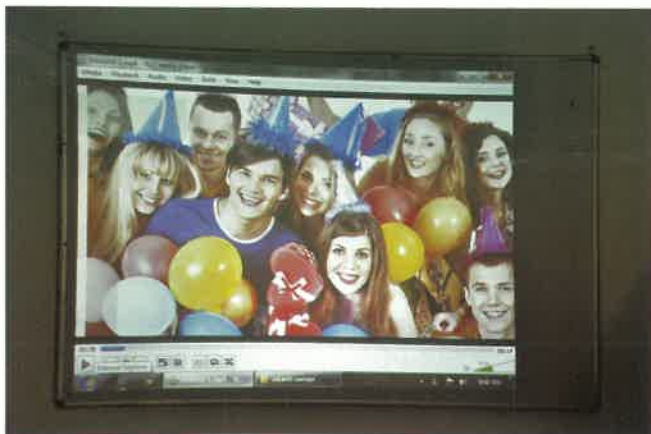

Hopefully, "Wherever they go, they spread smiles; May they go ahead, miles and miles".

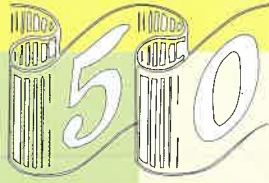

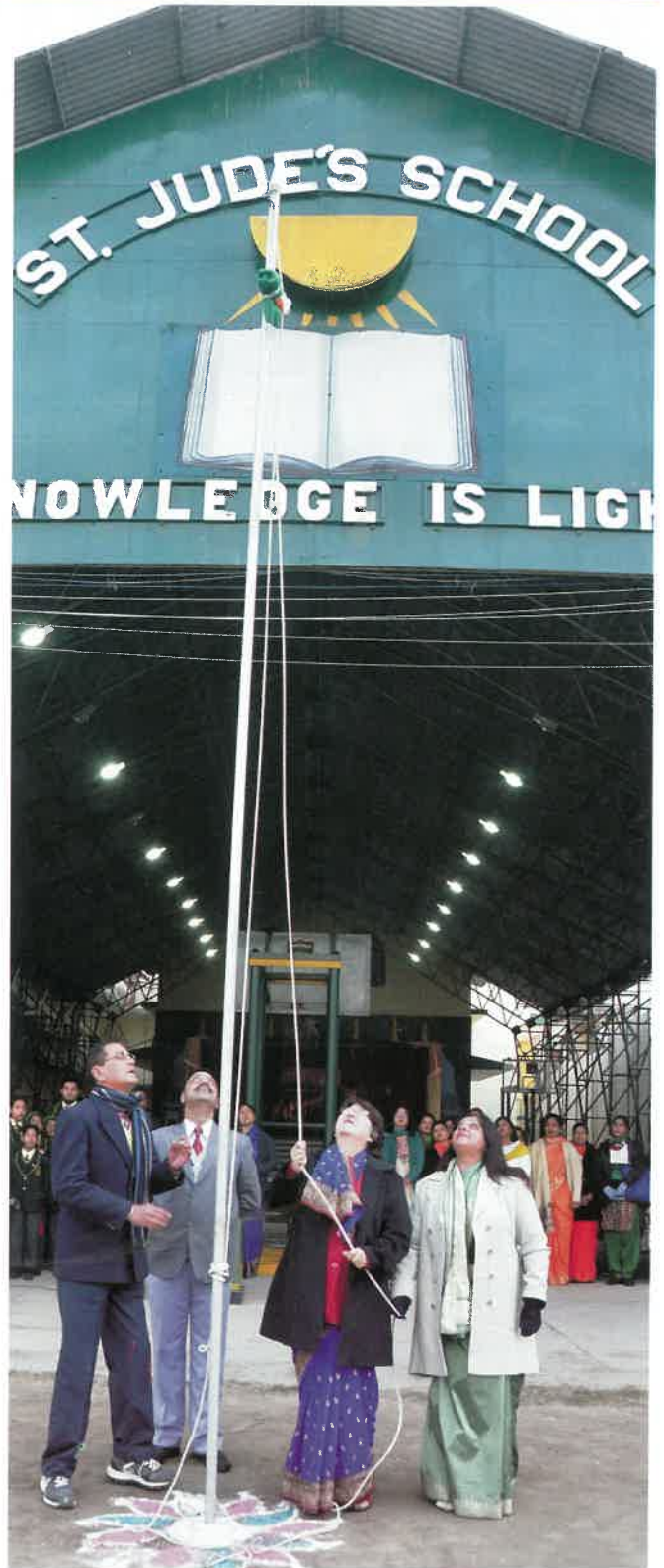

Edible Password Pill – The most mind-blowing inventions about to hit the markets goes to Motorola's edible password pill. The pill, consisting of tiny chip that uses the acid in stomach to power it, is safe to be digested having passed food safety standards in the US.

Smart Trash Can – Japanese engineer Minoru Kurata developed the Smart Trash Can last year. When a rubbish is tossed at trash can, a sensor detects the position of rubbish, sends information to a computer which calculates where the rubbish will fall and informs trash can via wireless connection.

Humanoid Robot – An American robotics company has developed a bipedal humanoid robot to perform search and rescue tasks. Its design and production is overseen by US Department of Defense which maintains that it is only intended to be used by emergency services for tasks such as opening doors, shutting valves and operating equipment in environments where humans are at risk.

3-D Pen – The toy company Wooble Works developed 3 Doodler Pen, a device that allows doodles to expand beyond 2D surface. The pen works by heating up and dispensing a thin plastic filament, that cool downs quickly to create hardened structure.

Mind Reading Camera – Japanese tech company Neurowear's high-tech headgear aims to capture the most hilarious adorable moments. The device straps a camera and an electroencephalogram. During moment of high frequency electronic signals detected through the skull, a general indication of excitement, the camera switches on to record.

New Camera Sensor Eliminates Need for Flash – Created by a team of researcher at Nyang Technological University (NTU) in Singapore, the new sensor is highly sensitive to both visible and infrared light. The sensor which is 1,000 times more sensitive to light than the imaging sensors of most of today's cameras. It is made of grapheme. The sensor uses the light trapping nano structures that use grapheme as a base. This result is a more fine quality image than a usual image, like a photograph captured by digital camera.

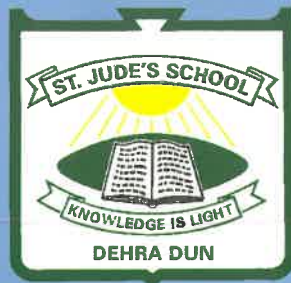
