



Good Afternoon, Board Members, parents, guests and well wishers. I would like to extend a warm welcome to our Chief Guest Mr. Stephen DaCosta, Principal, The Frank Anthony Public School, New Delhi, who has come all the way from Delhi to be with us on this very important day of our School Calendar.

I would like to congratulate our Board Member, Mr. G.I.G. Mann on the occasion of becoming the MLA of the Minority in Uttarakhand Legislative Assembly. Mr. Mann's family and Mr. Mann himself have had a long association with St. Jude's School. Sir, we at St. Jude's feel very proud of your achievement.

In the last 23 years St. Jude's School has established itself as an institution of learning. We focus on the development of our students. The curriculum and programmes are all planned to develop our students' talent and potential.

St. Jude's School is celebrating its 23rd Annual Speech and Prize Day today.

Due to the numbers in the School we have two Prize Days. We have already had the Primary School Prize Day, where 283 students received prizes for their achievements. Today, the prize winners are 87 and the participants are 217.

In community work, St. Jude's School provides valuable services throughout the year. We continuously help out in the calamity affected areas of the hills. St. Jude's School organizes visits to the Old Age Home and areas where they are exposed to situations which help them to empathise with the sad and the down-trodden.

I would like to thank my generous parents who understand the need for their children to be humane towards those around them, no matter what caste/creed/colour/race/rich or poor.

At present St. Jude's School is imparting knowledge to 3517 students under an efficient and qualified Teaching Staff of 131 teachers. We have around 54 Support Staff to help them and look after the children outside the classes.

In the past year once yet again we excelled in Academics.

In the ICSE Examinations 2015-16 we had excellent results. Out of 263 students who appeared, 30 achieved above 90% and 58 between 85-89%. The class average was 80%. Our top scorer was Ritik Taneja who secured 98% followed by Raghav Agarwal with 97%.

In the ISC Examinations out of 193 students who appeared, 35 scored above 90% and 18 between 85-89%. Rishita Gogia topped by scoring 98%.

Congratulations to the parents and teachers.

Games play a very important part in our curriculum. We have been organizing games daily after School. Cricket, Football, Basketball, Chess, Badminton and Table Tennis are enjoyed by our students daily. I would like to thank our parents who understand the need of games and sports and allow their children to stay back after school. In sports our teams brought laurels to school in the following events:

In the Times Doon Shield 2016 (Inter-School Cricket Challenge Trophy) St. Jude's School won the trophy for the second time.

St. Jude's was the Runner-up team in the Council Inter School Junior Boys Futsal Tournament organized by the Carman School, Dalanwala.

In the Council Sub-Junior Boys Inter School Cricket Tournament, 2016-17, St. Jude's School was the Runner-up.

In the Inter School Junior Indoor Cricket Tournament 2016, we were the Runner-up.

At the Wynberg-Allen Sports Meet Rishabh Khuntiya of VI-D broke the 100m record set in Wynberg-Allen School and won the gold medal. He also won the bronze medal for 400m race. Varun Malik of VI-D won bronze medal for triple jump. Rishabh Khuntiya and Rashika Malik were also awarded the trophies of the most Promising Athletes.

Not only in Sports but also in various Co-curricular activities our students have done well:

In 'Milestone', an Annual Event held at St. George's College, Mussorrie, Ekta Dhiman with her remarkable artistic skills was adjudged the winner of 'Shoe Hue' competition.

At 'Spectrum' the Annual Extravagance of St. Thomas' College, Agraj Nagarkot and Prerna Kandwal of St. Jude's School came second in the Solo Singing Category. In the Times of India Quiz Challenge-2016, Vinayak and Harsh both were awarded for their achievements with special trophies.

In Quanta 2016-17, an International Academic Festival organized by the City Montessori School, Lucknow, Raahul Singh, with his remarkable debating skills, was adjudged the best speaker and bagged the 1st position.

In the Council Inter School Song & Dance Competition (Junior), organised by Carman Day & Residential School, Dalanwala, St. Jude's School was declared the winner.

In the Inter School Debate Competition at Asian School our school came third.

In MindSpree, 2016, an Annual Creative Festival organized by St. Jude's School, our students did well in the following events:




final round.





For this purpose we conduct an integrated creative and academic festival 'Rendezvous' and Inter House Debate is the most awaited session of this festival. "In all the debates


let truth be the aim, not victory or an unjust-interest."






The debate was adjudged by Mrs. Poonam Ahuja, Mrs. Vinita Kalia and Mrs. Chenna.






Council Inter-School Dance and Singing Competition (Junior)














The Annual Inter-Section Little Champs Quiz 2016


Council Inter-School Senior Boys Football Tournament







68th Republic Day Celebration


26th January 2017




