

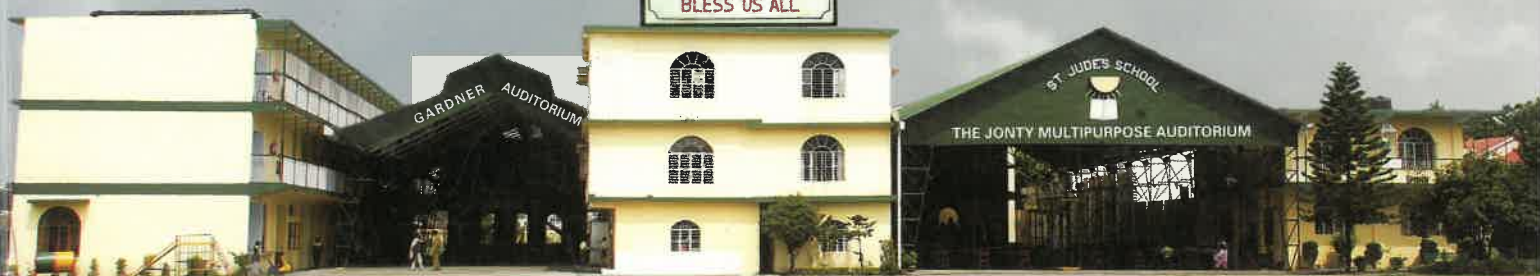

PRINCIPAL'S ANNUAL REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to welcome Mr. G.I.G. Mann the MLA of the Uttarakhand Legislative Assembly as our Chief Guest and his wife Mrs. Susan Mann who will be giving away the prizes.

I would like to welcome Mr. R.V. Gardner our President along with Mrs. J. Shepherd, Mr. E. Barrett, Ms. Michelle Gardner, Mrs. Sharon Barrett for coming to our 24th Annual Speech and Prize Day.

Thank you dear friends, well wishers and guests for taking time out to be with us today.

We had our Prize Day for the Primary School yesterday, where we had 269 students receiving prizes and trophies for their achievements. Today we have 63 students receiving their prizes from classes VI to XII.

We at St. Jude's School believe that our students must

be guided and exposed to many challenges. We give them opportunities to participate in Debates, Quizzes, Dance, Singing, Science Exhibitions and Games. Our students do their best and they make their families and School proud of them.

At St. Jude's we have 3444 students getting education under 135 experienced teaching Staff and to help them we have 60 support Staff and Ayahs.

We make our students aware that they are the leaders of the future. They must be compassionate and do something to make our country clean and work towards helping the Traffic Police for the safety of commuters.

The Year 2017-18 has been an eye opener for us all. Our students have seen the changes in our country and the world. We are trying to prepare them for the future by organizing career counseling and introducing new types of jobs or career for themselves. Smart Classes are great opportunity for our students to be absolutely clear about what they learn.

We at St. Jude's School make our students understand the need of the hour is to heal the world. Conserve water, electricity, plant trees and care for animals.

I would like to congratulate our ICSE and ISC students, Teachers and Parents for the excellent Board Result 2016-2017. In Class X the average marks were 76%. Out of 224 students 15 students achieved above 90% and 32 students between 85 and 90%. Our Top scorer in the ICSE Examination was Siddharth Raj who obtained 93.4% followed by Vednat Gunsola with 93.2%.

175 students appeared for the ISC Exam; our average Class percentage was 74%. Eleven students scored above 90% and 21 students scored between 85 and 90%. Ashish Dhyani topped by scoring 95%.

Our students have undertaken 'Project Vidya' in which children distribute food and clothing to the needy. Thank you Parents for your support. My Parents understand that we have to move with the times and make our students compassionate.

At present we are trying very hard to let our students realize the good and bad of the internet and mobile phones. MindSpree endeavours to reflect on what it is to study and learn in an environment which we feel is conducive to the development of our students. Our endeavour is to bring joy back to learning.

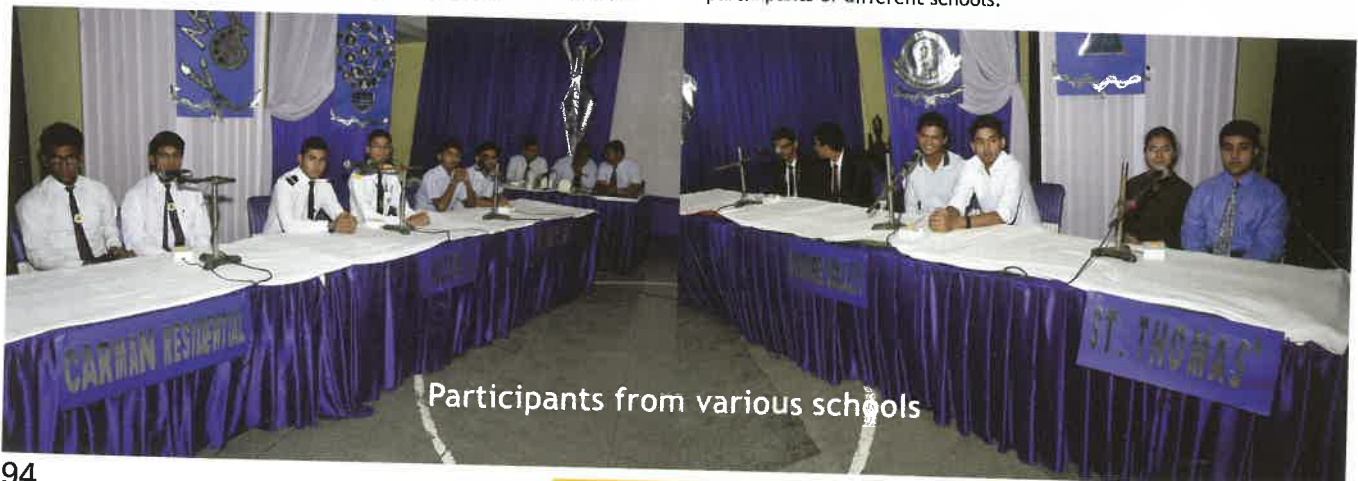

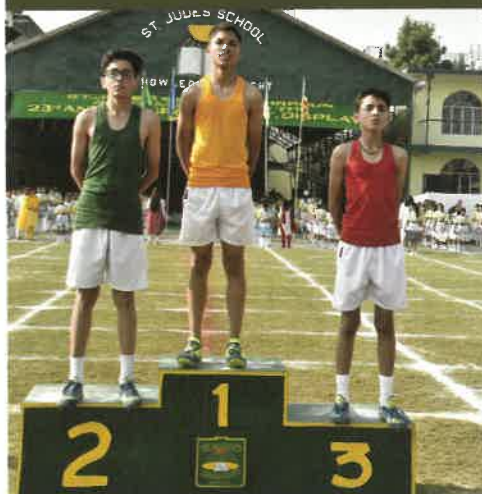

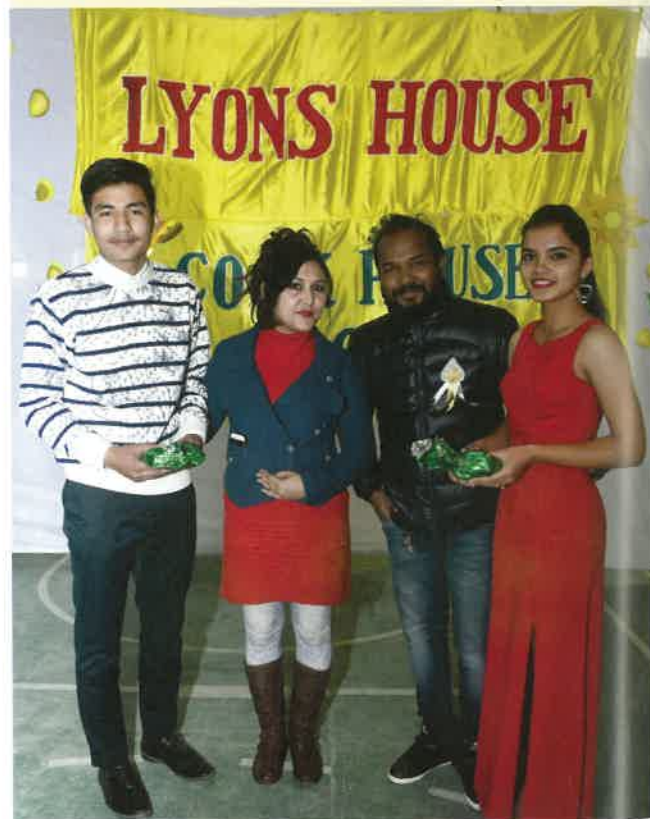

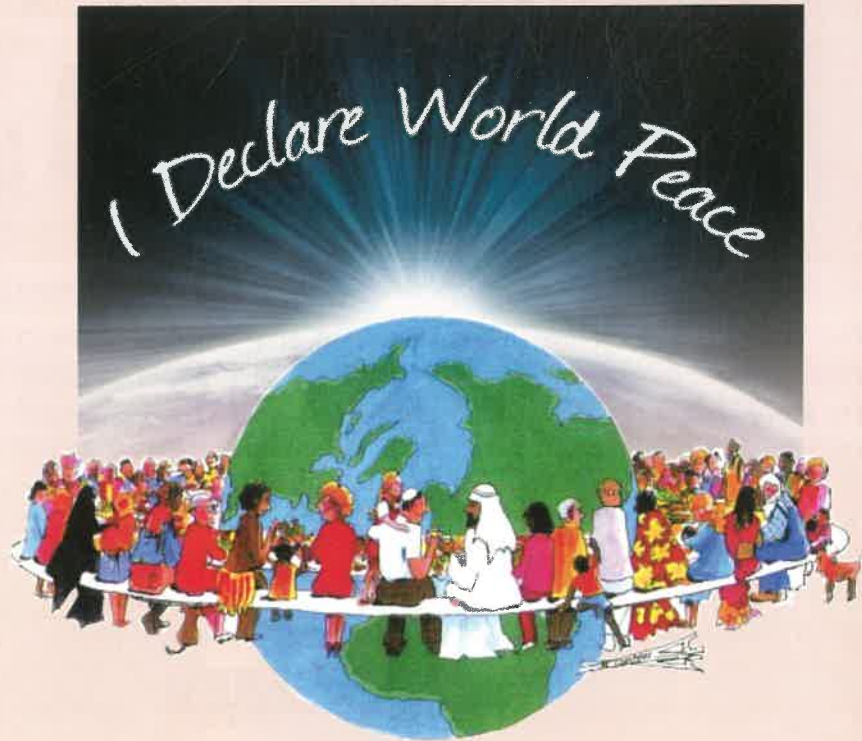

The Life And Career Of Lionel Messi

Lionel Messi was born on the 24th of June 1987 in Rosario, Argentina. Messi was born into a rather poor family but from his childhood he always stood out in Football. He used to play with his elder brother's friends unintimidated by the bigger boys. At the age of 8 he was recruited to join the youth system of Newell's old boys, a Rosario based club, recognizably smaller than most of the kids in his age group. Messi was eventually diagnosed by doctors as suffering from a hormone deficiency that restricted his growth. Messi's parents, Jorge and Celia decided on a regimen of nightly growth hormone injections for their son though it proved impossible to pay several hundred of dollars per month for medication. So, at the age of 13 Messi was offered the change to train at Football powerhouse FC Barcelona's youth academy, La Masia, and have his medical bills covered by the team. Messi's family packed up and moved across the Atlantic to Spain. Although he was often homesick in his new country, Messi quickly moved through the Junior System ranks. By the age of 16 Messi made his first appearance

for FC Barcelona. He put himself in the record books on May 1st, 2005, as the youngest player to ever score a goal for the franchise. That same year he led Argentina to the U20 FIFA World Cup title, scoring on a pair of penalty kicks to propel the team over Nigeria. Messi steered Barcelona to a wealth of success when the left footers team captured the Championship League, La Liga and Spanish Super cup in the same year. After two consecutive runner-up finishes he took home his first FIFA best player award (Ballon d'Or). Messi has now won the following:

- 4 Champions League
- 9 La Liga's
- 5 Ballon d'Or
- 4 Golden Shoe (best scorer)

Messi has won 32 trophies in his amazing career scoring 616 goals with 250 assists in 761 games in his club career. Today Messi is known as one of the greatest players to ever play this game of Football.

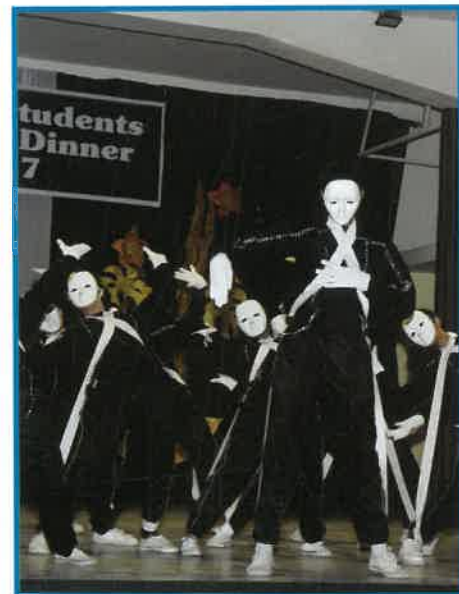

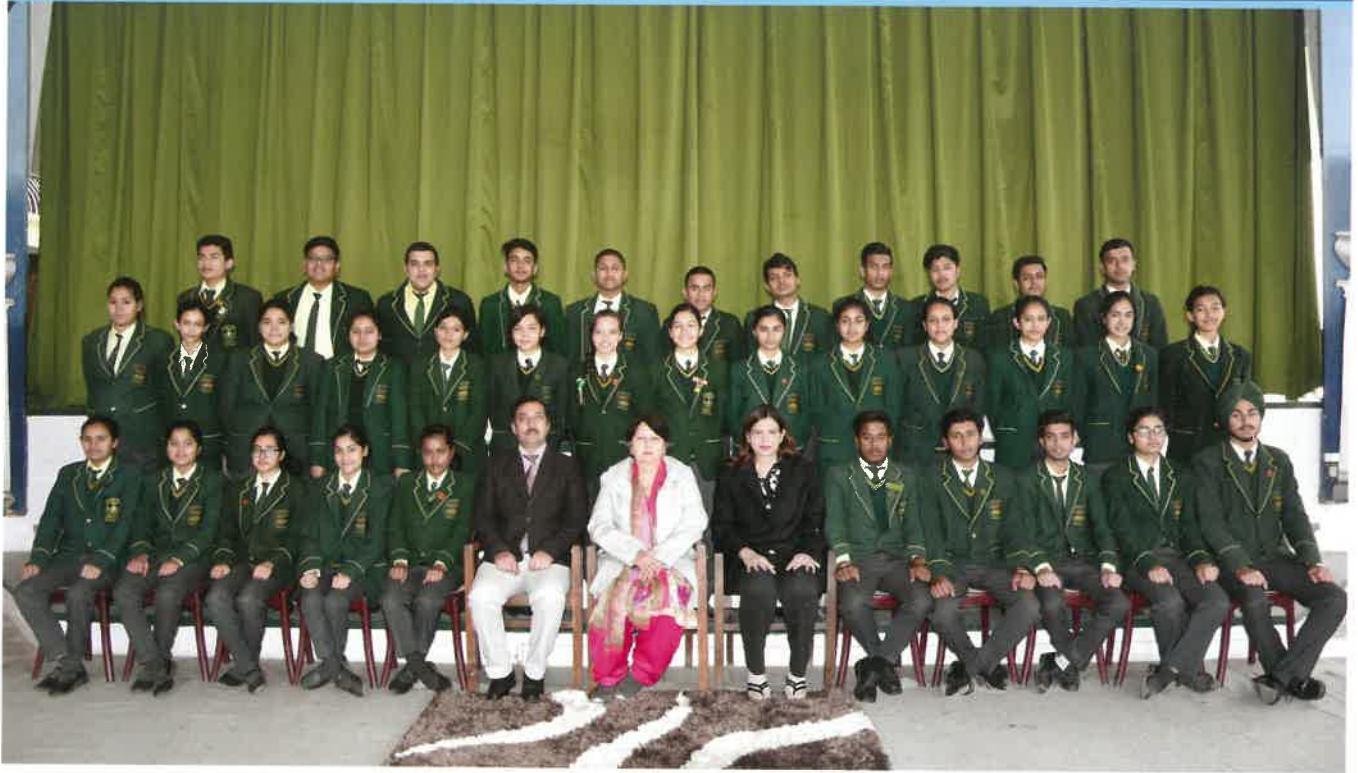

Now buried really deep.

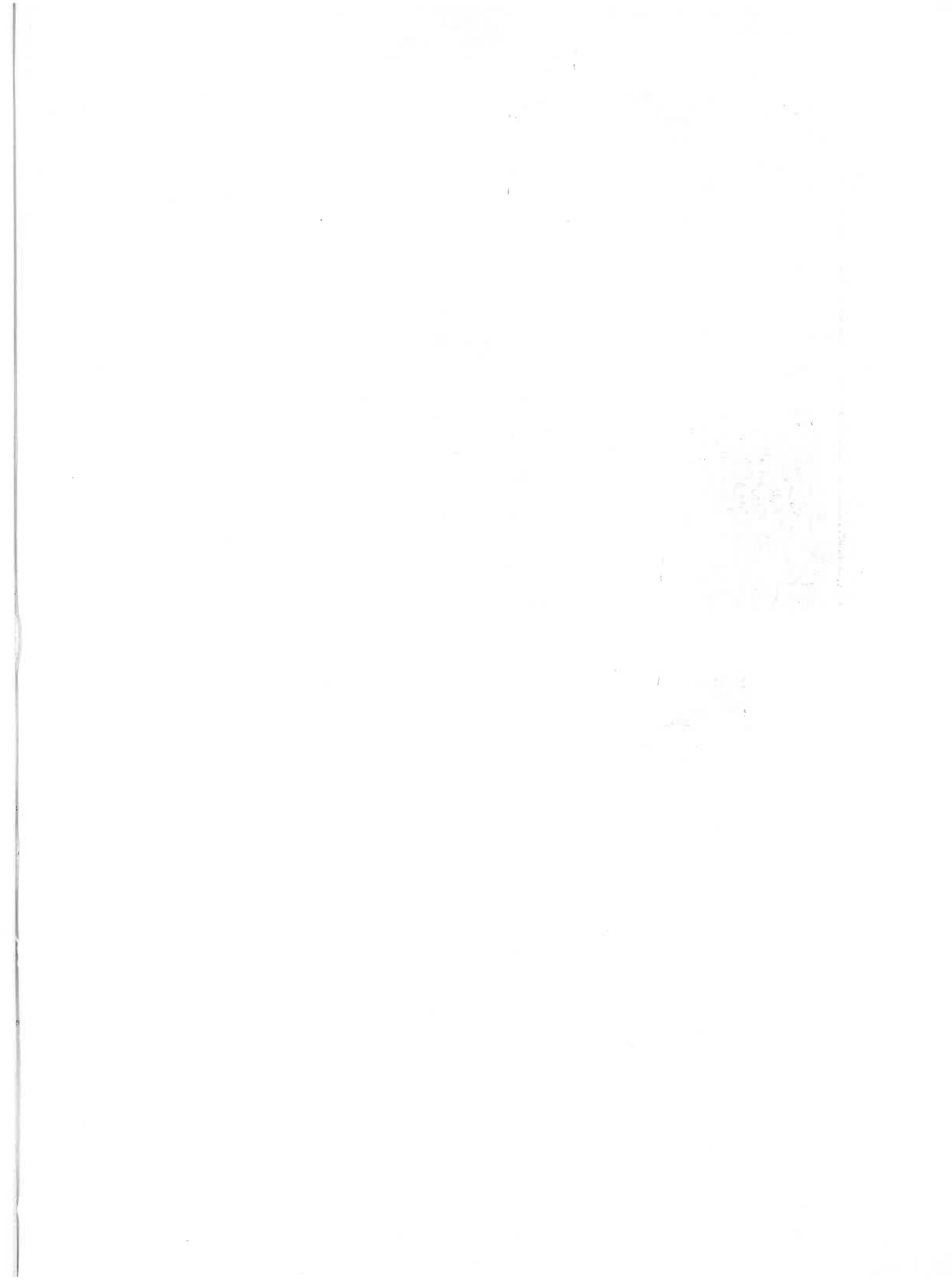
My life was not easy to live

A strong heart and mind!

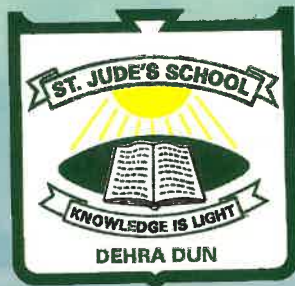
Doctors – doctors all around,
