We are celebrating the Silver Jubilee of St. Jude's School this year. I would like to congratulate my Staff, Students, Parents and Support Staff for being along with our family since 1994.

A lot of hard work has gone into making our School what it is today. I personally feel our School is one of the Best schools not only in Dehradun but in the Country.

My Staff members are loving, caring and ready to take up any challenge we face. At the helm is my Vice Principal Ms. Michelle Ann Gardner who is a very creative and energetic person who does

not miss any opportunity to set platforms for our students to be on and face any competitions. I am blessed with a very friendly Staff who help our students as well as one another. This I would say is the greatest blessing; they do not look at the clock and work, they work till they are absolutely satisfied with their task being completed.

My Office Staff gives up their holidays voluntarily so that they can ease the work load of the Teachers. Yes they understand what we have to do; they deal with all the problems we have to face. They understand that this is a Family we have to nurture, guide and prepare our students for their future.

We have three thousand four hundred and twenty two students with us and the parents are very supportive. They realize how competitive this world is and they want their children to leave St. Jude's School as well-balanced adults who are sure of the values taught, who are confident and winners. Our students know they are loved at home as well as at School and are truly educated to take up any profession their parents want or they choose for themselves.

This year the Board Result was the best we have ever had! In Class X the Class Average percentage for Science was 85% and for Commerce it was 81.34%. Out of 243 students, 64 students achieved above 90% and 56 students between 85 and 90%. Avanya Jain topped by scoring 97% followed by Ayushi Rathore and Sameer Goyal who also scored 97%.

177 students appeared for the ISC Examination. Our average Class percentage for Science was 82% and for Commerce it was 70%. 21 students scored above 90% and 17 students scored between 85 and 90%. Shefali Goyal topped by scoring 99% followed by Mohak Kala 96%.

Well done students. Congratulations Teacher and parents. I would like to mention here how hard Ms. M. Gardner works along with the students; she will not let them move on unless she is satisfied that the students have gained confidence to handle the subject on their own!

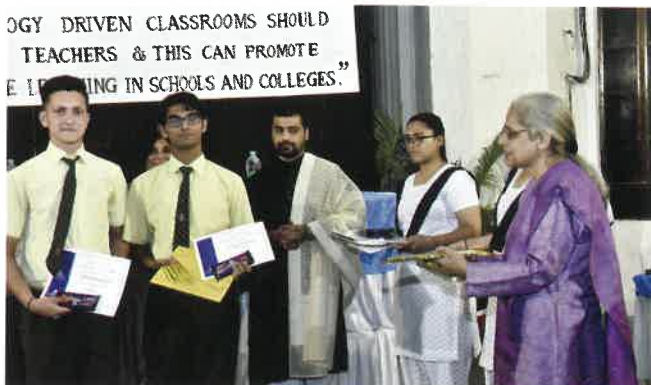

The registration time was 6.45 a.m. and the race was to begin at 7.45 a.m. from the Headmaster’s gate, Mall Road. The event involved no age bar. Volunteers could run, walk or skate a distance of 4.5 km.

This campaign was an excellent opportunity for students to learn about an inspirational young man who overcame his medical adversities including leg amputation caused by his osteosarcoma (a type of bone cancer). During his own osteosarcoma, Terry Fox was motivated by the stoic acceptance shown by other cancer patients. He promised himself to raise funds for cancer research and started his “Marathon of Hope” from New Foundland on the East Coast of Canada. He

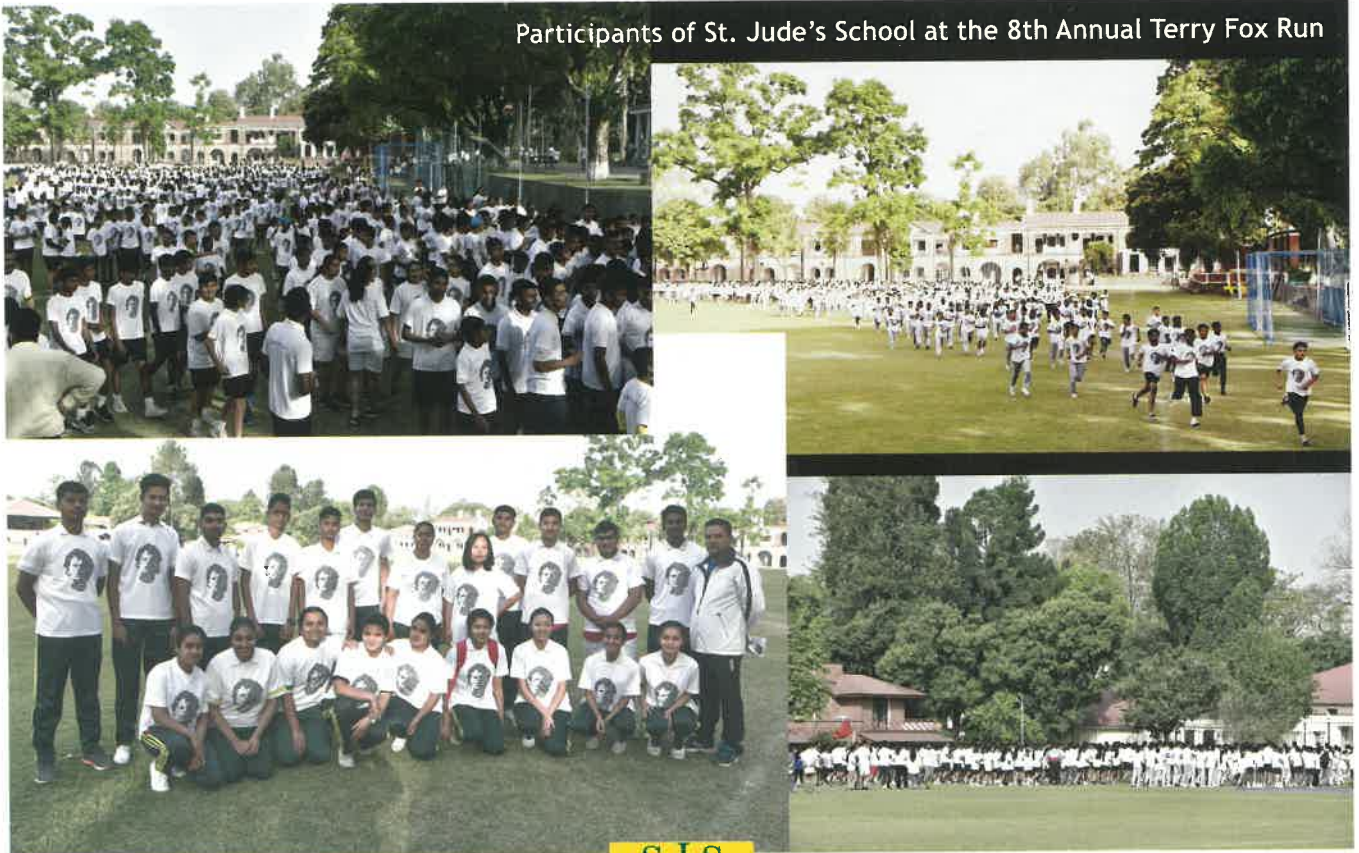
ran an average of 42 km a day with a prosthetic leg, but succumbed to his disease’s relapse before he could reach his destination after 143 days and 5373 km. The race ultimately cost him his life but his efforts resulted in a lasting worldwide legacy. This annual meet is put up to celebrate his effort and the spirit behind his pledge.

The first run held in 1981 involved millions of participants in over 60 countries and is now the world’s largest one-day fund raiser for cancer.

The participants were required to register prior to the run without any registration fee, donations were welcomed and were used for Cancer Research in India. The event received continued support in creating awareness for the noble cause and in helping finance research so that there may be a cure for this terrible disease. \$750 million has been raised in his name as of January 2018.

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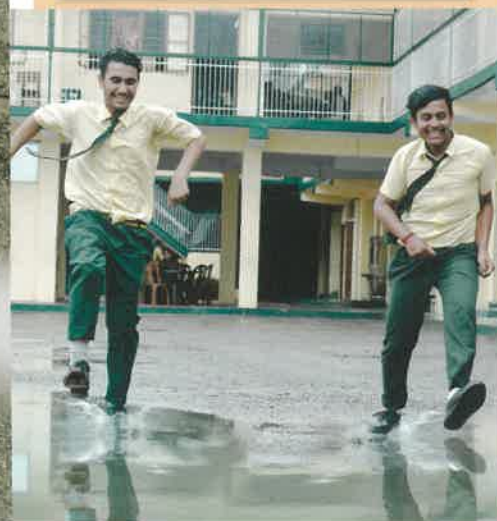

In the Junior Division Aduvet Raizada, Ayshi Arora and Shivaansh Saxena were the participants.

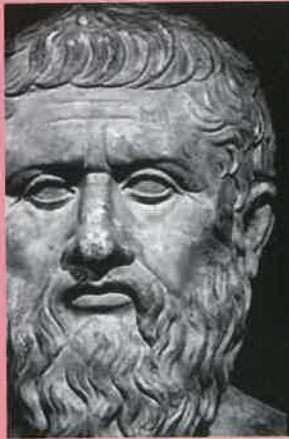

Project I Change My City Challenge

By: Janaagraha Centre for Citizenship and Democracy and Gati Foundation

Gati Foundation is a policy and research oriented think tank in Dehradun in Uttarakhand. The focus of research at Gati is on the issues of the Himalayan state of Uttarakhand and its people. The NGO is working very closely with the government and community on the subjects of environmental policy and regulation, urban governance, sustainable mountain development and public health.

Its objective is to push forward the agenda of sustainable development through careful planning of micro and ground-based interventions.

Janaagraha, a Bengaluru based organisation where Gati is a local partner, is acting as a helping hand, in the execution of the project 'I Change My City'. The objective of the project is to sensitize students regarding the different civic issues of their cities. It targets students from classes 6 to 12 and educates them about the leading civic issues prevailing in their respective cities. The challenge comprises 10 schools from Dehradun where 50 students from each school participate creating 10 teams from each school. Each team comprises 5 students.



In collaboration with the above, among the 50 schools of Dehradun, St. Jude's was one to be privileged to work with the Gati Foundation. On the 12th of October, 2018 students from classes VI-XII were chosen and divided into different teams. Mr. Sahil Tomar assisted the students on behalf of the Gati people for how to carry on with the project work.

The issues identified were Traffic and Footpath. Ten teams along with their team leaders were taken to different locations where they interacted with local citizens of their area and spoke about the daily problems faced by them concerning Traffic and Footpath issues. Children also spoke to the Traffic Police authorities at Katcheri Road regarding the problems faced by them due to the increasing traffic. The students were assured by the authorities that proper remedial measures would be taken into account i.e. challans would be imposed, more people will be allocated at different places to maintain traffic management. Footpath measurements were taken into account by our children, where the advantages and disadvantages of Footpath were taken into consideration. Parking issues were also among the others issues discussed.



The Network for City-Systems Reforms (NCSR) a pioneering initiative by Janaagraha supported by the Mumbai based strategic philanthropy organisation 'Dasva' is envisaged as a collaborative network of civil society organisation working towards driving systematic reforms in urban governance.

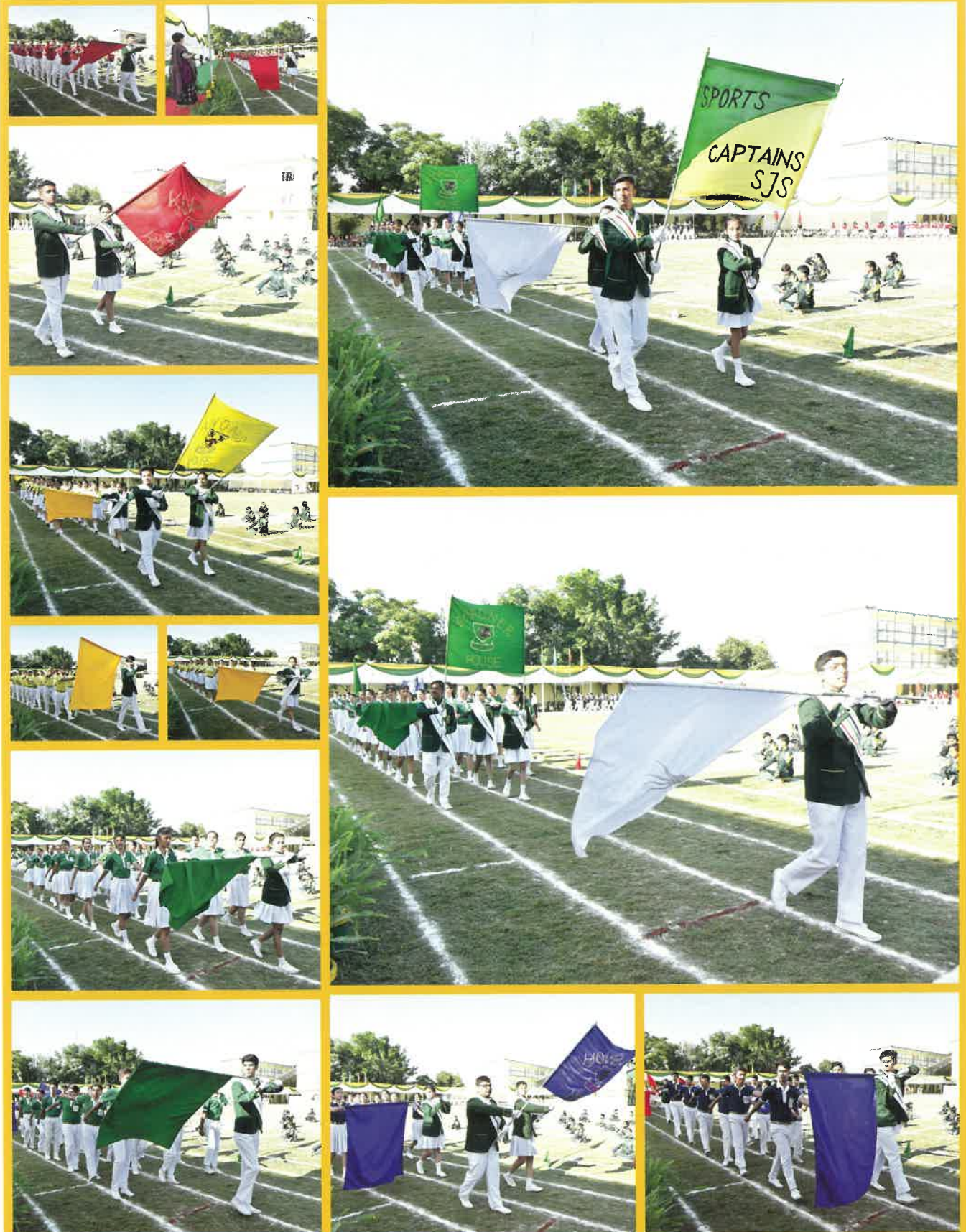

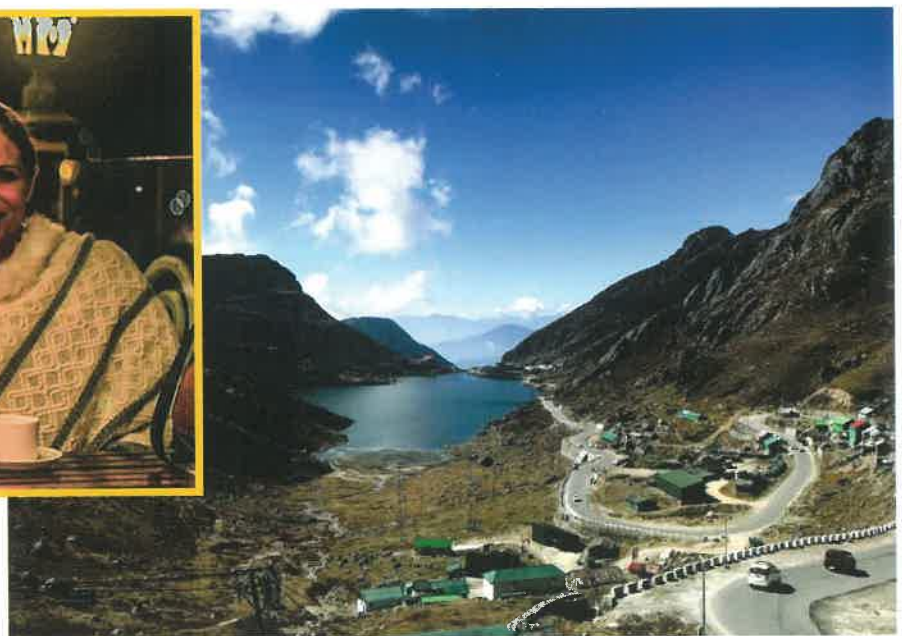


temple in Sikkim.

Workshop for Teachers

In addition to being well-versed in one's area of expertise and having the ability to plan and execute lesson plans, successful teachers also need to possess a few 'Extra Personal Skills'. St. Jude's from time to time organizes workshops for the teachers to foster them with these essential skills.

This year Mr. Philip Burrett, Deputy Head Master (Retd.), Doon School, was invited to conduct a workshop for Teachers on the 12th of October 2018. He discussed with the teachers of St. Jude's School certain specialized teaching skills to deal with the children of the 21st Century who are profoundly exposed to internet and social media.

One most significant skill discussed was, patience in the present environment. Things have changed with time. Gone are the days when students were asked to have patience, now is the time when children tend to like to test their teacher's patience and as good educators the teacher must try a few mindful techniques to remain being patient. Mr. Burrett has explained that 'Patience is bitter but its fruit is sweet'. Mr. Burrett emphasized on the creativity a teacher should have as he/she must have the ability to think outside the box. He gave the example of an English Teacher who can enter the class by reciting a nice poem instead of entering the usual way. This may bring some change in the attitude of today's children, so one must take time to think and use one's imagination and tap into one's creative side to make the classroom environment more friendly and more effective. Another important skill a teacher should foster is the skill of engaging the students. If a teacher has the ability to engage his students and have an amicable relationship with them, it will make the classroom more interesting



and fun to be in.

After this, the teachers present there were asked to communicate with each other, as a part of workshop and it was observed, this communication was only the exchange of information to achieve a better understanding, but it lacked collaboration. Through this activity, it was made clear to the teachers that collaboration adds to the goal of moving collaborative information forward and collaboration is only possible with proper communication. Communication and collaboration is an essential skill a teacher should have, as it not only helps the teacher but also helps prepare students for their future.

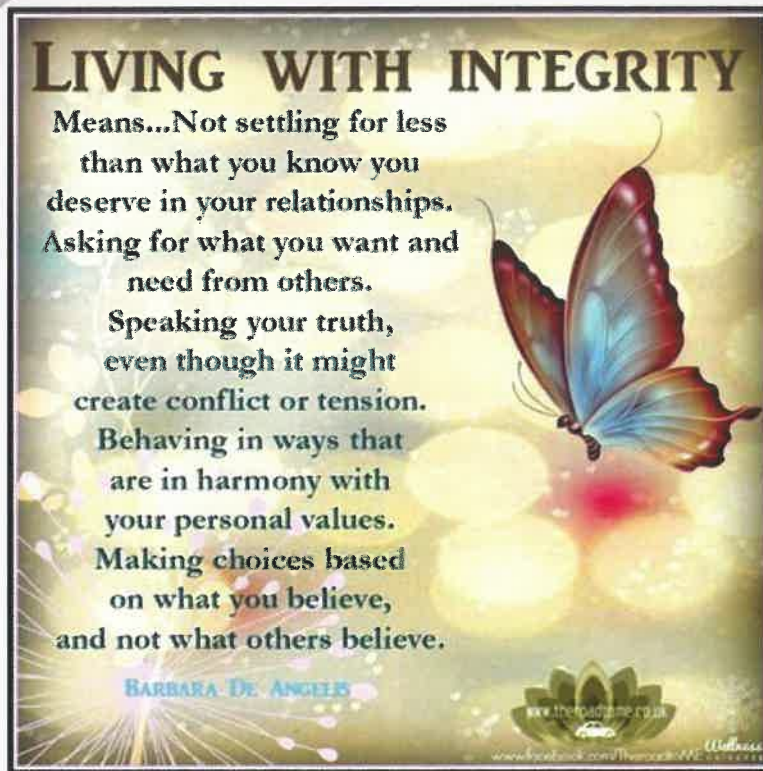
Other than this, we discussed that teachers should not constrain themselves to old methods of teaching, they should use modern techniques, make PowerPoint presentations, practice many activities for their classroom to make their teaching more effective. In order to discipline the students, teachers need to be self-disciplined. A successful teacher himself is always a student, who has the will-power and the ability to keep pace with his or her students.

The workshop ended with the opinion that all you have to do is, be mindful to what skills one needs to retain as a teacher and practice implementing them each and every day to make one's teaching more effective and successful. 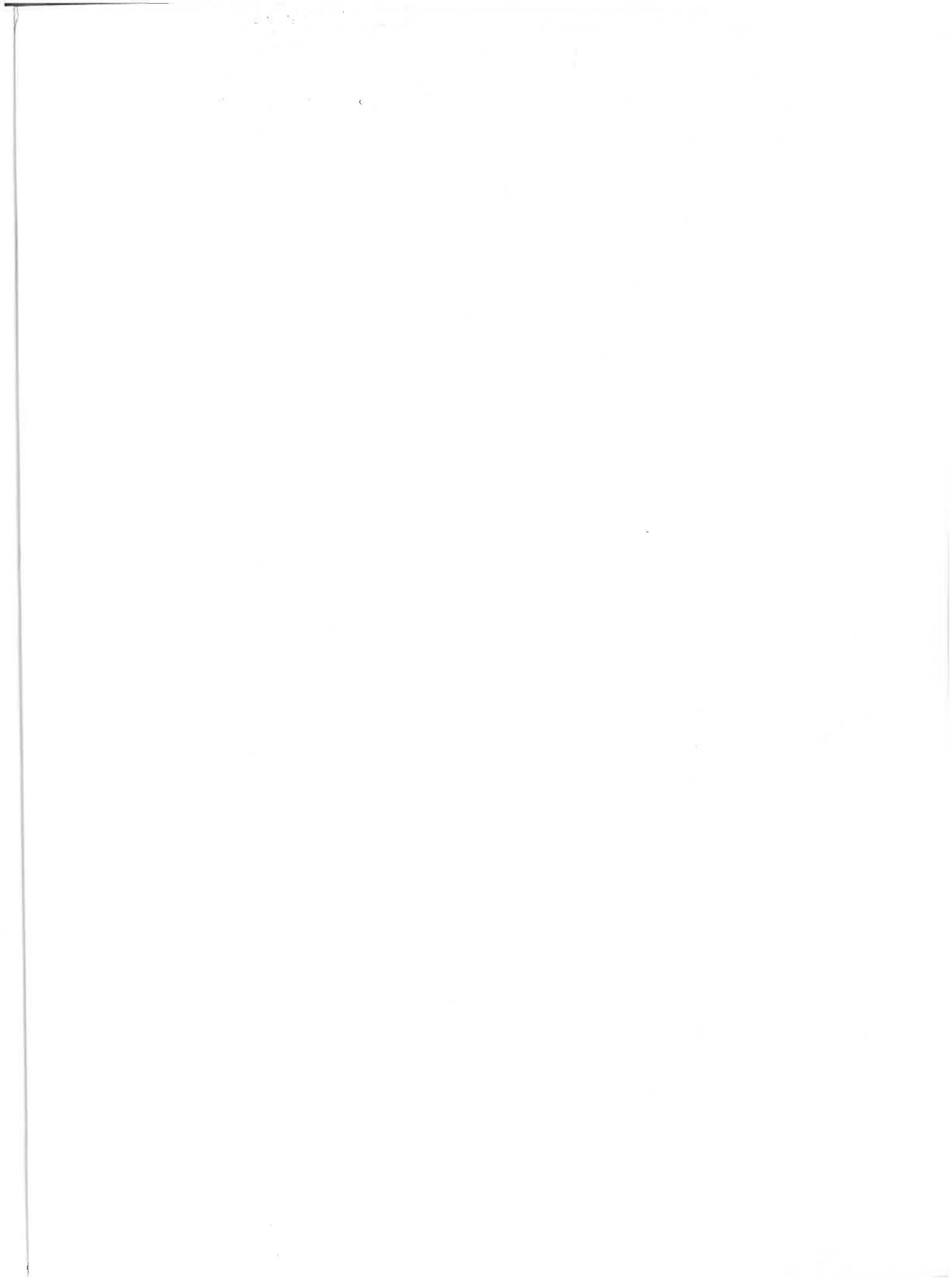
you can still scream in your anguish. You can hold yourself, when no one else can.

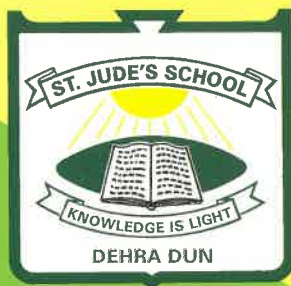
