
The Puppet Show


This year too had a plethora of such events and tales of team spirit. The Inter-House Senior Football matches began on the 28th of August 2011.


The third match was played between Lyons House and Howard House; Lyons House lost by 5-0.

Students by way of visual images put their views across on different topics after careful research and analysis. The various presentations were almost professional in nature. They were informative and left the audience awestruck.








Every year an Inter-School Dance and Singing Competition is organised by Carman School and we have been an active participant since its inception.
















Annual Christmas Festivities


A presentation that brought back old memories made everyone present practically burst into tears... this presentation was created by Param Dutta, Avinash Singh and Satpal of Class XI.










Inter-School Sub-Junior Boys Indoor Cricket Tournament






Being Blissful Without Any Reason




